Patrick Mandapaka, H-GAC gave an overview on developing a memorandum of understanding for the future coordination on the North Houston Highway Improvement Project (NHHIP). After his presentation, he welcomed discussion and comments from members of the Council.

APPROVAL OF A WORKGROUP TO CREATE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE NORTH HOUSTON HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Background

At the meeting in June, Transportation Policy Council has approved to develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between various agencies on the North Houston Highway Improvement Project (NHHIP). In addition, TPC has recommended the TPC Chair to appoint a Workgroup to assist with the development of the MOU and to present that to TPC's approval.

The purpose of the MOU is to articulate the understanding that multiple agencies, including H-GAC, Texas Department of Transportation, City of Houston, Harris County, Harris County Flood Control District, and Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County (METRO), will work cooperatively in the planning and implementation of the NHHIP. The MOU can also provide a description of responsibilities or commitments from each agency.

Current Situation

TPC Chair, Kenneth Clark will nominate members at the TPC meeting to serve on the workgroup to develop the MOU for the NHHIP and will seek TPC's approval.

Action Requested

Approval a Workgroup to develop a Memorandum of Understanding between various agencies on the North Houston Highway Improvement Project.

WHEREAS, the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan was adopted by the Transportation Policy Council on April 5, 2019; and

PRESENTATION ON THE SUSTAINABLE WAYS TO INTEGRATE FUTURE TRANSPORTATION (SWIFT) STUDY

Background

The Houston region faces unprecedented changes in technology, population growth and development, and an ever-expanding platform of transportation options. In response, the Texas Department of Transportation's Houston District sought to better understand how these changes might affect the transportation network. In 2019, the Planning Section of the Houston District kicked off a subregional study entitled Sustainable Ways to Integrate Future Transportation (SWIFT). The goal of the study was to identify a way to answer the questions "what if". What if commuter rail was implemented in the region? What will the effect be of autonomous vehicles? What if we have another large scale, major residential development?

The study covered an area of more than 600 square miles in the west Harris and Fort Bend/Waller area. A Project Advisory Committee composed of local subject matter experts was complimented by a Peer Review Committee composed of worldwide experts.

The result of the study is the SWIFT tool, an exploratory modeling tool based on data-driven, performance-based and scenario planning methodologies, to study and evaluate future uncertainties in land use, travel behavior, mobility policy, and emerging technologies at a subregional scale. The tool is designed to help planners and policy makers explore a wide range of future uncertainties, model and evaluate their impacts, construct feasible scenarios, identify future needs, and narrow the focus area for transportation infrastructure investment at a regional level. The tool provides an easy to understand GIS-based graphic user interface for users to quickly build scenarios, evaluate impacts with quantitative performance measures while also assessing potential risks associated with each scenario. TxDOT staff will present results from the SWIFT study.

PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND TARGETS

Background

A performance-based transportation planning process is a federal requirement in the development of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). Federal legislation created Transportation Performance Management to focus federal funds on addressing the challenges facing the transportation system. Performance management is a powerful analytical tool for tracking performance over time and can illustrate how we are meeting the regional goals for improved performance of the transportation system. The process for measuring performance consists of gathering data, formulating a quantitative forecast, setting targets, monitoring conditions, and reporting target progress over four-year periods. The first federal performance period is 2018 to 2022, with biennial reporting at the mid-point in 2020. H-GAC has responsibility for these federal performance measures in the key areas of safety, pavement and bridge assets, reliability, congestion, air quality and Transit Asset Management. Back in 2018, the Transportation Policy Council adopted targets for 2020 and 2022.

Current Situation

H-GAC has reached the mid-point of the four-year performance period, therefore, biennial reporting is required by the federal deadline of September 30, 2020. H-GAC staff has been gathering and analyzing data, researching underlying conditions and assessing progress toward achieving the 2020 targets and forecast and adjusting the 2022 targets. A public comment period for the draft performance recommendations began July 8 and ends August 8. The draft recommendations of target progress and reporting can be viewed at: http://www.h-gac.com/transportation-performance-measures/default.aspx and http://www.h-gac.com/transportation-performance-measures/scorecard.aspx.

Over the next two months, staff will continue working with local governments, subcommittees, the Transportation Advisory Committee and the Transportation Policy Council to review and finalize the draft targets, future target adjustments and reporting. In order to meet the September deadline, the Transportation Policy Council is scheduled to approve the targets and performance reporting at its September 25th meeting.

Draft performance, target achievement and targets adjustments for the performance areas of safety, pavement and bridge assets, reliability, congestion, air quality and Transit Asset Management are identified in the tables in the following tables.

RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE AMENDMENTS TO THE NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM

Background

Periodically FHWA, TxDOT, and MPOs conduct a review of the region's highways and intermodal connectors designated on the National Highway System (NHS). In 2018, TxDOT hired Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (Jacobs) as the consultant to conduct an initial review of the statewide NHS. This review is to be completed before September 2020.

As you may recall, in April 2019, H-GAC staff presented the initial recommendations to the Technical Advisory Committee, RTP Subcommittee, and Freight Subcommittee for review and comment. After two rounds of collaboration and participation from several communities, recommendations were provided to FHWA and TxDOT in July 2019 for their review. FHWA and TxDOT, through Jacobs, have now provided the results of their review and seek regional concurrence with the recommendations.

Major considerations for NHS inclusion:

- Serve major activity centers or intermodal facilities
- Service long-distance travel needs and connect large regions
- Provide mobility across a region, especially between outlying areas and the urban core
- Avoid residential areas and provide limited access to surrounding land uses
- Directly link Interstate Highways, Freeways, or Expressways

PRESENTATION ON THE TRANSPORTATION RESILIENCY AND DURABILITY STUDY

Background

In the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, the Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) applied for and was selected to participate as a pilot in the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA)Resilience and Durability to Extreme Weather Pilot Program. Beginning in Spring 2019, H-GAC began work with federal, state, and local partners to conduct a criticality and vulnerability assessment of transportation assets in the 8-County Houston-Galveston Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) region. The vulnerability assessment will use FHWA's Vulnerability Assessment Scoring Tool (VAST) which includes consideration of exposure, sensitivity, adaptive capacity, and risk. Resiliency recommendations will be developed based on criticality and vulnerability assessment results. The results from the vulnerability assessment can be used to prioritize funding for future transportation projects.

Current Situation

H-GAC staff in coordination with consultant assistance provided by the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI), finished the criticality and vulnerability assessment for road segments and bridges to extreme weather events in the H-GAC MPO region. The team also identified potential adaptation strategies to protect vulnerable and critical assets and developed criteria that H-GAC can consider when selecting a strategy.

On May 12, 2020, H-GAC shared the results and strategies with external stakeholders including federal government, local government, nonprofit, and academic representatives. The following is a brief summary of the results:

Criticality Assessment Results: Out of the 762 centerline freeway miles and 6,440 major road miles in the region, 92 centerline freeway miles (12%) and 551 centerline major road miles (9%) are found to be highly critical.

Vulnerability Assessment Results: With respect to vulnerability, 13% of freeway centerline miles and 12% of major road centerline miles are found to be highly vulnerable to flooding, storm surge and sea-level rise.

Criticality-Vulnerability Matrix: The intersection between the criticality and vulnerability assessments – known as the Criticality-Vulnerability Matrix – was developed to identify those assets that are both highly critical and highly vulnerable, and therefore a priority for mitigation strategies in the project area. Around 9.5 centerline miles of freeway and 48 centerline miles of major roads are found to be highly critical and highly vulnerable to extreme weather events.

Regional Resilience Tool: As part of the pilot study, the team developed the <u>Regional</u>

<u>Resilience Tool</u> to display the criticality and vulnerability of road segments. The tool also includes the modeled flood exposure depth grid data, which identifies the specific parts of the road segment that are vulnerable to flooding. This information is useful in planning road improvements and developing mitigation strategies.

Adaptive Capacity Mitigation Strategies: Using best practices set forth by the FHWA and stakeholder input, the team created 25 Adaptive Capacity Mitigation Strategies as listed below:

- Stormwater Management
 - 1. Increase Number of Swales and Ditches
 - 2. Retention and Detention Ponds
 - 3. Depressed and Raised Medians
 - 4. Bioswales (Biofiltration Swales)
 - 5. Green Infrastructure
- Maintenance
 - 1. Culvert Cleaning / Maintenance
- Planning/Social
 - 1. Stormwater Management Plan
 - 2. Land Use Planning/Climate Justice
 - 3. Relocate or Abandon Roads
 - 4. Shelter-in-Place
 - 5. Evacuation Route Identification and Planning
 - 6. Prohibiting Overweight/Oversize Vehicles
 - 7. Sensor Technologies and Monitoring Programs
- Infrastructure
 - 1. Enhanced Road Surface
 - 2. Enhanced Sub-Grade
 - 3. Hardened Shoulders
 - 4. Raised Road Profile
 - 5. Geosynthetics/Geo Textiles
 - 6. Permeable Pavement
- Other

REPORT ON TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ACTIVITIES

A. LONG RANGE PLANNING

1. Sub-regional Planning Initiatives (SPI)

- The Brazoria County Thoroughfare Plan has been finalized. The Plan will be presented to Commissioner's Court at a to be determined date.
- Staff continue to finalize the scope of work and budgets for Southeast Harris County Sub-Regional Plan and Liberty County Mobility Plan.
- Staff began initial work on the Montgomery County Precinct 2 Mobility Plan and are finalizing consultant scope and budget.

2. Safety/Operations Planning

- Staff attended the launch of the City of Houston Vision Zero Campaign.
- Staff attended the Texas A&M Transportation Institute 2020 Traffic Safety Conference
- Staff host Transportation Safety Committee meeting on June 23, 2020
- Staff conducted radio interview regarding hurricane preparedness and evacuation on July 9, 2020
- Staff is collaborating with TxDOT to advertise off-system safety improvement funding available thru TxDOT for roadways and intersections
- Staff is working to update the Congestion Management Process plan

3. Freight Planning

- Staff are finalizing the scope of work for an update of the 2013 Regional Goods Movement Plan
- Staff are coordinating a meeting of the Greater Houston Freight Committee to be held in early September.

4. Regional Incident Management

- Staff had a coordination meeting with the Houston Police Department and Harris County Sheriff Office on operations with the Tow and Go Program on June 1, 2020.
- Staff held a virtual Traffic Incident Management Meeting on June 11, 2020.
- There were 2,594 "No Cost" Tows in the month of June; a 14% decrease when compared to June of 2019.
- Tow and GoTM Average Clearance Time in June from Notify to Cleared was 14 minutes and 22 seconds
- Harris County open bids for towing Contracts for Tow and Go Towing.
- SHRP2 Traffic Incident Management Training continues to be suspended because of COVID-19.

5. Environmental Planning

Staff has completed the "Quick User Guide" to the Eco-Logical tool which is designed to teach a new user how the tool works in several short steps. The guide is going through the final edits

before publication. Staff have also begun talks with a contact in the Houston Independent School District (HISD) to discuss the prospect of students using the Eco-Logical tool within the environmental science or social studies curriculum. The initial talks have revealed an apparent interest in introducing the tool to the classroom.

6. Resiliency Planning

- Staff began development of a Low Impact Development study to examine how to costeffectively integrate low impact development into transportation projects in the Houston area.
- Staff continue work on the Resilience & Durability Pilot project as part of the FHWA program to develop transportation-sector specific resiliency best practices and strategies across the country. The project is expected to be finalized July 2020.

7. Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)

A meeting of the Regional Transportation Plan Subcommittee was held on June 10. Staff presented a draft outline and schedule of the next RTP update, an update on the Congestion Management Plan, and an introduction to Performance Measures. The next meeting of the RTP Subcommittee is being planned for early September.

8. Other Planning Activities

Staff continue to monitor regional travel impacts of COVID-19. Regional travel volumes are monitored through StreetLight data and transit ridership numbers are reported monthly from transit agencies within the region.

B. SHORT RANGE PLANNING

1. Project Programming

- Staff has worked over the last month to finalize all revisions to the draft 2021-2024 TIP document. Additional information about the TIP will be presented at the June meeting for TPC action.
- Last month H-GAC staff processed 6 Administrative Amendments to the TIP and RTP.
- Discussions on the Transportation Development Credit (TDC) policy and possible new uses of the available credits continued at the TIP Subcommittee. Efforts to update the current policy will continue over the next few months as staff continues to refine the policy at the subcommittee level before bringing recommendations to the TAC and TPC.

2. Pedestrian and Bicyclist Planning

- Staff updated data on H-GAC Website for Mobile Counters program for 2020.
- Staff held coordination meeting with Sugarland regarding multimodal connectivity project
- Selected consultant for bike safety training classes
- Staff conducted a site visit to troubleshoot and send for repairs the bike counter at MKT Trail and 5th Street in Houston.

3. <u>Transit Planning</u>

- A grant application was submitted to TxDOT for the Regionally Coordinated Transportation Plan (RCTP) for 2022-2026. Response from TxDOT should be forthcoming in July 2020 on the application and funding level. Planning activities on the RCTP are expected to begin September 1, 2020.
- A draft TAM plan has been completed. Updated analysis and targets will be reported to TAC and TPC in July along with public comment. Approval is tentatively scheduled for September 2020.
- Staff continues to conduct a monthly survey regarding the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on regional transit providers. This survey will continue during the course of the pandemic.
- Staff has received a revised final report from Texas Southern University detailing the performance and acceptance of an autonomous vehicle that operated on campus between June 2019 and February 2020.
- Coordination continues between H-GAC and METRO regarding the Regional Transit Seamless Fare System.
- Implementation of The Woodlands Township Energy Corridor Commuter service is delayed until at least January 2021 due to COVID 19. A meeting with the principals will be held in August 2020 to determine next steps.
- A brief Transit Feasibility Assessment will be conducted for the City of Huntsville to determine viability of enhanced public transportation in the community. The assessment is scheduled to be completed by August 31, 2020.
- Staff facilitated a remote meeting of the Regional Transit Coordination Subcommittee (RTCS) on July 9, 2020. Subcommittee members elected a new Chair and Vice-chair and were briefed on several of the above-listed items.
- Christopher Whaley was hired as a Planner Specialist to assist with transit and bike and pedestrian planning.

4. North Houston Communities Transportation Priorities Study

- Staff continues the Advance Funding Agreement process with TxDOT through June.
- Staff is continuing internal coordination in preparation for the kick off of this project.
- Staff scheduled a scope review meeting the an informal workgroup made up of community organization representatives along segment 2.

C. TRANSPORTATION PUBLIC OUTREACH

1. General Transportation Outreach

- Public outreach staff hosted a virtual Brown Bag webinar on June 15 in conjunction with Houston TranStar. The total number of attendees was 100.
- Public outreach assisted in the coordination and promotion of the Commute with Confidence webinar for employers returning to their worksites. Other cities are now beginning to use the Commute with Confidence resource as a model for their own.

• In addition, staff have been working to update information and materials related to the Mobility Report, and also prepare for the launch of the Zip Zone Map campaign, Tow and Go's expansion, and the upcoming transportation studies throughout the region.

2. Commute Solutions

- Staff participated in NARC (National Association of Regional Councils) virtual conference from June 8 June 9.
- Staff participated in a variety of internal meetings and staff development trainings.
- Staff participated in weekly Vanpool Task Force Meetings with METRO STAR
- Staff participated in the procurement process to secure a Telework Consultant
- Staff created, prepared, and executed a internal Commuter Survey to gauge telework impacts and commute to work plans.

D. CLEAN VEHICLES/HEAVY DUTY DIESEL REPLACEMENT PROGRAMS PLANNING ACTIVITIES

1. Clean Vehicles Program

- Staff continues is working with several ISD's to replace older school buses, most recently Pearland ISD seeking Board approval for six (6) new buses
- Staff is working with several grant recipients to finalize contracts and complete invoicing.
- Staff continues to respond to incoming phone calls and email requests for program information.
- Staff continues to monitor grant recipient's usage of vehicles to assure grant requirements for vehicle use and mileage are met.
- Staff participated in a variety of internal and external meetings.

2. Heavy Duty Diesel Replacement Program

- Staff continues to work with grant recipients to finalize contracts; and complete invoicing
- Staff continues to respond to incoming phone calls and email requests for program information
- Staff continues to monitor grant recipient's usage of vehicles to assure grant requirements for vehicle use and mileage are met.
- Staff participated in a variety of internal and external meetings.

3. AERCO - SEP

 Tentative results were presented to the Transportation and Air Quality (TAQ) Subcommittee
 for discussion on April 16. Revisions are currently underway and it is anticipated that drafts
 will be available for public comment in July, then presented to the TAQ Subcommittee for
 approval in August.
- H-GAC staff is continuing to assist with regional efforts to support the Department of Energy (DOE) sponsored Houston-Galveston Clean Cities Coalition. Under the auspices of this program, staff works with regional fleets to foster economic, environmental, and energy security by working to advance affordable, domestic transportation fuels, energy efficient mobility systems, and other fuel-saving technologies and practices. Staff has developed a program of activities for 2020 and anticipates involvement with several new and novel types of events including: podcasts, webinars, and, potentially, alternative fuel site visits in the latter half of the year. The first webinar is scheduled for May 21st and will focus on funding availability to help interested fleets continue to make the transition to alternative fuels even in these difficult times.
- Staff has completed closeout activities for the now-completed DOE-sponsored Zero Emission Delivery Vehicle Demonstration Project. This project resulted in the deployment of 18 all-electric delivery vehicles at UPS locations within our region. Despite the conclusion of project activities, most of these vehicles will continue to operate on our region's roads.
- Staff is continuing to work to administer EPA-funded DERA grants to deploy all-electric yard tractors at local freight warehouses. Staff is currently working with IKEA and H-E-B to finalize the contracting process in order to move forward with vehicle purchases.

F. TRAVEL DEMAND FORECASTING

- Staff continues to provide travel demand modeling and GIS technical supports and
 assistances to support H-GAC's internal planning work and H-GAC's member agencies such
 as TXDOT for their various corridor and sub-areas transportation planning and studies and
 additional select link analysis for the Inner Katy assessment project. Modify and refine PM2
 maps for the NHS system roadways, Summarize ACS 2017 and 2018 MOT (mode of
 Transportation) for the 8-counties region. On-going
- Staff continues to provide modeling support through the use of the REMI model for the analysis of the COVID-19 Impact, and continues to use the REMI model to model and evaluate the impact of the 10 year and 500 year flood plans of the Resilience Project for Harris County Flood Control District On-going
- Staff continues to develop highway networks as input forth the AIMSUN Meso and Micro modeling for Montgomery County Precinct 2 subarea study. On-going
- Staff continues to assist with the Activity Based Model development on going
- Staff continues to work with the Steering Committee of the Origin-Destination On-board Transit Survey to evaluate and resolve some issues and concerns caused by the COVID-19 pandemic in the scope of services and methodology originally drafted for the forthcoming 2020/2021 on-board transit survey. On-going

- Staff continues to work with City of Houston Aviation department to develop a MOU, scope
 of services, sample size, and timeline for regional commercial airport (IAH & Hobby)
 ground access count travel survey. On-going
- Staff continues working on the acquisition of the location-based software which lets user see how people are travelling within the eight-county region and understand how this may be changing throughout the day. On-going
- Staff continues to review INRIX speed data to look at speeds and travel times to determine the impact and assist the COF with her Tow and GO program. On-going
- Staff continues to assist with the North Houston Highway Improvement Project- Helping with task 2 data collection. Mapping existing recommended projects(RTP,TIP, Livable Centers, etc.), transit routes and stops, bike lanes, sidewalks, B-cycle locations., GTFS Feed- Creating GTFS feed for local transit agencies, Montgomery County PCT 2 mobility plan- Creating study area map, and FHWA MMNCP- Creating online interactive map for Ped/Bike study in Sugar Land. On-going
- Staff continues to assist with the development of Python Scripts for Center-Lane miles, and Speeds
 Analysis before and during COVID pandemic, HPD Minor crash Pilot project and the sub-regional
 studies of the dashboard program. On-going
- Staff continues with various updates of the: MOVES, SEE calculation, Fuel economy calculation, conformity timeline, re-formatting of the VMT mix, air quality master schedule and the off-network activity calculations. On-going

H-GAC Board of Directors Report July 21, 2020

1. <u>CLEAN VEHICLES AND HEAVY DUTY DIESEL REPLACEMENT ASSISTANCE AGREEMENTS</u>

Request authorization of agreements with four Independent School Districts for the acquisition of thirty-two school buses; amount not to exceed \$3,266,758.

2. <u>PUBLIC OUTREACH CAMPAIGN FOR THE TOW AND GO PROGRAM</u> Request authorization to buy media ads for billboards, radio airtime and social media to conduct a Tow and GoTM Public Outreach Campaign. Total amount for media buys not to exceed \$375,000.

3. <u>CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR TELEWORK PROGRAM ANALYSIS,</u> IMPROVEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION

Request authorization to negotiate contract with consulting firms in the order presented for an amount to not exceed \$300,000 to provide consultant services for the telework program analysis, improvement and implementation for H-GAC and other employers in the region.
