Chair Lents noted that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

Receive comments or questions from the public

Chair Lents briefly reviewed the amendments to the President's contract, noting the changes have been reviewed by the Long-Term Financial Planning Committee, and are appropriate and reasonable for the work provided, and are in line with comparable positions for other special districts and authorities. The Board commended the President on her strong performance to date and her ongoing commitment to the Authority. Upon motion by Director Zeve, seconded by Director Manriquez, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Consent Agenda items.

CHAIR REPORT

Chair Lents discussed the City's current review and vetting of infrastructure projects in connection with various policy concerns, including roadway lane reduction, lane width, and expanded pedestrian and bike pathways. She advised that while Phase 1 of Shepherd Durham will continue as is, Phase 2 has been paused.

PRESIDENT REPORT

Ms. Weesner deferred her report in the interest of time, advising she would provide comments for specific items as the agenda progresses.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Director Manriquez next reported to the Board on financial matters.

Authorize Payment of Invoices

The Board reviewed the invoices submitted for payment. Chair Lents advised that the Projects Committee has reviewed project-related invoices, and recommended approval. Director Manriquez advised that the Finance Committee has also reviewed the invoices put before it and recommended approval.

Following discussion of the invoices, a motion was made by Director Zeve, seconded by Director Manriquez, and approved unanimously by the Board to approve the payment of all invoices presented.

REVIEW BUDGET FOR FY 2025

Chair Lents advised that because of the possible impact of the Shepherd/Durham pause, the Authority will not review a draft CIP today, and that it will be deferred to a future meeting.

Confirm Engagement of Auditor

The Board then considered the confirmation of the Auditor for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024. Ms. Villareal advised that McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot, PLLC ("MGSB"), currently has an evergreen contract with the Authority for preparation of the annual audit. She also advised that a single audit will be necessary in connection with the disbursement of grant funding. The Board then discussed engagement, noting that the cost should not exceed \$23,500.00.

Upon motion by Director Manriquez, seconded by Director Hale-Harris, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to confirm the engagement of MGSB for preparation of the Authority's audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024.

PROJECTS AND ENGINEERING

The Board next received an update on Authority projects.

Chair Lents advised that due to time constraints, certain project related items on the agenda that require specific action will be taken up first, and the written order of the agenda will not be followed. She noted, however, that all agenda items will be covered.

PROJECTS IN DESIGN AND ACTIVE STUDIES

Waugh Drive and South Heights Safety Improvements

Update on project development

Ms. Hennings reviewed project development, noting 60% design plans and an updated traffic report have been submitted to the City for review.

Approve Work Authorization No. 21 – Waugh Willia Traffic Analysis Services (TGC)

Mr. Webb reviewed Work Authorization No. 21, advising that TGC will provide additional traffic analysis support for the improvements at the Waugh/Willia intersection at a cost not to exceed \$11,247. Upon motion by Director Zeve, seconded by Director Stein, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve Work Authorization No. 21 as presented and authorized execution.

White Oak at Greenleaf

<u>Update on project development</u>

Ms. Hennings reviewed project development.

Approve Work Authorization No. 19 - Project Coordination and Grant Management (TGC)

Mr. Webb reviewed Work Authorization No. 19, advising that TGC will provide support services for grant management, plan review and approval, bidding, construction, and NEPA requirements at a cost of \$38,627. Upon motion by Director Zeve, seconded by Director Manriquez, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve Work Authorization No. 19 as presented and authorized execution.

Approve Work Authorization No. 1 – Final Design Safety Improvements (Quiddity)

Ms. Hennings reviewed Work Authorization No. 1, advising that Quiddity will provide specified design and topographic surveying services for the project for an amount not to exceed \$62,000. Upon motion by Director Zeve, seconded by Director Manriquez, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve Work Authorization No. 1 as presented and authorized execution.

Congressional District 7 Sidewalk Improvement

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner reviewed the proposed project, noting leadership from Congresswoman Fletcher and hopeful inclusion in the evolving Transportation Bill.

Approve Work Authorization No. 20 - Grant Management, NEPA, and Compliance Services (TGC)

Mr. Webb reviewed Work Authorization No. 20, advising that TGC will provide grant management, NEPA, and compliance services associated with the project at a cost not to exceed \$50,866. Upon motion by Director Manriquez, seconded by Director Hale-Harris, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve Work Authorization No. 20 as presented and authorized execution.

GENERAL & NON-CIP SERVICES - APPROVE WORK AUTHORIZATION NO. 2

Ms. Weesner discussed the ongoing need for general services from Quiddity. Ms. Hennings then reviewed Work Authorization No. 2, advising that Quiddity will continue general services for a not to exceed amount of \$25,000. Upon motion by Director Manriquez, seconded by Director Hale-Harris, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve Work Authorization No. 2 as presented and authorized execution.

PROJECTS IN CONSTRUCTION

Ms. Hennings briefly reviewed the Project Overview Map showing the locations and status of active projects.

Shepherd/Durham and Selected Cross Streets - Phase 1

Update on project construction

Mr. Kainer presented a photographic review of construction progress to date, noting that progress is speeding up due to nearly complete utility work. He discussed progress on Shepherd from 15th to 20th street, advising that sidewalk installation is rapidly progressing. He advised that installation continues on water lines, storm sewer, Silva Cells, and pavement. He advised that communication with business owners continues, and concrete pouring is taking place at early morning hours to minimize impact on traffic flow. He commended the construction crews on their skills and work efforts to date.

Engineering Services Contract

Ms. Weesner then reviewed an amendment to the CDM Smith engineering services contract. She advised that at the current rate of work, contract funds will be exhausted prior to completion date. As a result, additional funding is necessary in order to ensure project completion and change order administration. The current contract reflects a maximum amount payable of \$3,748,602. The amendment reflects an increased maximum amount payable of \$5,927,735. She stated that under current projections the maximum will not be reached. Upon motion by Director Manriquez, seconded by Director Hale-Harris, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the contract amendment as presented.

<u>Update on construction claims, damages, and litigation</u>

There was no update on project claims, damages, or litigation matters.

Yale and Center Street Intersection

Update on project construction

Ms. Hennings updated the Board on project progress, noting that surveying continues and that TXDOT managed construction is anticipated to begin in May. She advised that a construction timeline will be presented when available.

19th and Beall Area Pedestrian Street Safety Improvements

Update on project development

Ms. Hennings updated the Board on project progress noting that a contractor has been selected and that construction could start in June. She advised that she will provide a more firm construction start date once received.

North Canal Project

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner briefly reviewed ongoing stakeholder meeting discussions and actions. She noted likely higher than anticipated costs.

Shepherd/Durham and Selected Cross Streets - Phase 2

Update on project development

Ms. Hennings reviewed coordination undertaken with HPW, TXDOT, and private utilities up to the pause actions imposed by the City.

Little Thicket

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner advised that a plan update requested by HPW is currently underway.

Westcott Roundabout Greenspace

Update on project development

Ms. Hennings provided an update on the project, noting that design work and coordination meetings have commenced.

Stude Park Improvement

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner provided an update on continuing planning and design issues, including actions in development of the RFQ for a project overview and vendors.

Mobility Study for Shepherd/Durham Cross Streets, 8th Street to White Oak Bayou area, and 18th, 19th, and 20th Streets west of Durham

Ms. Hennings reviewed progress to date and the combined project components. Ms. Raschke and Ms. Young provided an update on design matters, noting that a meeting with the Projects Committee is tentatively scheduled within the next month.

Transportation Alternative Area Wide Study

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner updated the Board on project development. Mr. Webb reviewed TXDOT coordination and funding.

Pedestrian Improvements Shepherd at Memorial

Update on project development

Ms. Hennings provided an update on project development. She advised that 60% design efforts continue, and site-specific conditions have been reviewed and will be addressed.

Cherry Lorraine Nature Preserve/White Oak Bayou Connectivity

Update on project development

Ms. Weesner discussed the scope of the project, noting that design work is moving forward. Mr. Webb reviewed ongoing H-GAC and FTA efforts and coordination, including a possible funds transfer.

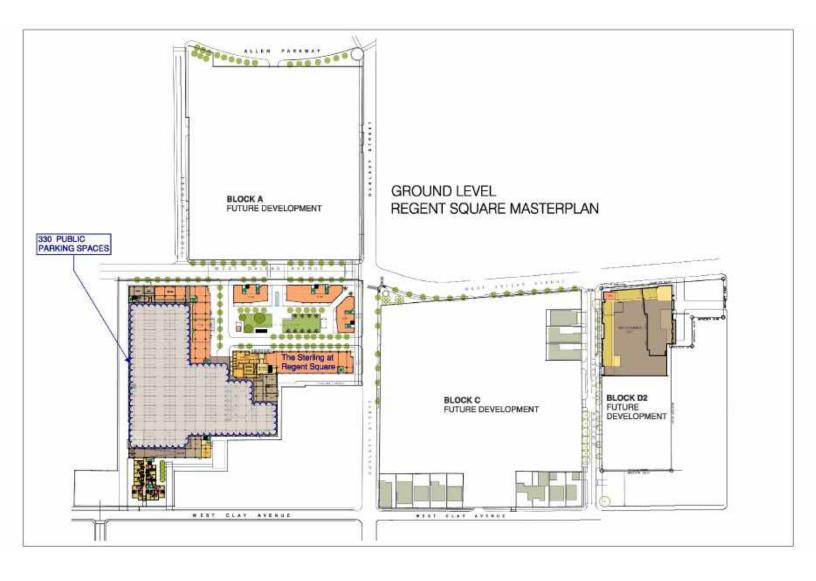

Memorial Heights Redevelopment Authority Monthly Financial Report Summary June Board Meeting Thursday, June 27, 2024

At the beginning of April, the Memorial Heights Redevelopment Authority (TIRZ #5) beginning Operating Fund Balance was \$52,038,168. TIRZ #5 received a total of \$1,560,070 mainly from Grant Income (\$988,627) and Interest (\$295,321). During the period, TIRZ #5 processed \$3,083,762 in disbursements during the period. 95% of the disbursements related to disbursements to SER Construction (\$2,689,837), CDM Smith (\$157,233), and Quiddity (\$81,932) for CIP Projects. The ending balance as of month end May 31, 2024 was \$50,558,029.

The invoices pending approval total \$2,183,270. See attached "Unpaid Bills Detail" Report for invoices pending approval and invoices paid in between board meetings.

There was \$2,847,319 spent for Capital Projects for the period. The projects that utilized the majority of the funding was T-0523A Shepherd/Durham Reconstruction (\$2,572,569). See attached "Capital Improvement Projects" Report on pages 4 and 5.

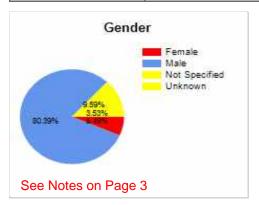

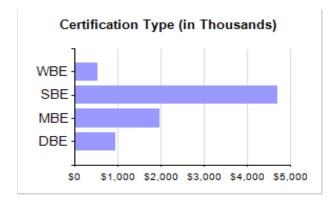

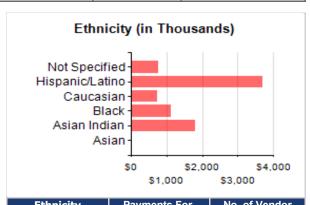

ORDER AMENDING RECORDS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Title 6, Subtitle C, Local Government Code, as amended (the "Local Government Records Act") provides that a special district must establish by order an active and continuing records management program to be administered by a Records Management Officer; and

WHEREAS, Memorial-Heights Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") desires to adopt an order amending its Order Establishing Records Management Program, consistent with the Local Government Records Act, and in the interest of cost-effective and efficient record keeping; NOW THEREFORE.

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MEMORIAL-HEIGHTS REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY THAT:

Section 1. Definition and Administration of Authority Records. All documents, papers, letters, books, maps, photographs, sound or video recordings, microfilm, magnetic tape, electronic media, or other information recording media, regardless of physical form or characteristic and regardless of whether public access to it is open or restricted under the laws of the state, created or received by the Authority or any of its officers or employees pursuant to law or in the transaction of public business (as further specified in the Local Government Records Act) are hereby declared to be the records of the Authority and shall be created, maintained, and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance or procedures authorized by it and in no other manner.

Section 2. Additional Definitions:

- (a) "Custodian of records" means, for purposes of this Order only, any consultant who by ordinance, order, or administrative policy is in charge of an office of the Authority that creates or receives records.
- (b) "Essential record" means any record of the Authority necessary to the resumption or continuation of operations of the Authority in an emergency or disaster, to the re-creation of the legal and financial status of the Authority, or to the protection and fulfillment of obligations to the people of the state.
- (c) "Permanent record" means any record of the Authority for which the retention period on a records control schedule is given as permanent.
- (d) "Records control schedule" means a document prepared by or under the authority of the Records Management Officer listing the records maintained by the Authority, their retention periods, and other records disposition information that the records management program may require.
- (e) "Records management" means the application of management techniques to the creation, use, maintenance, retention, preservation, and disposal of records for the purposes of reducing the costs and improving the efficiency of record keeping. The term includes the development of records control schedules, the management of filing and information retrieval systems, the protection of essential and permanent records, the economical and space-effective storage of inactive records, control over the creation and distribution of forms, reports, and correspondence, and the management of micrographics and electronic and other records storage systems.
 - (f) "Records liaison officers" means the persons designated under Section 9 of this Order.
 - (g) "Records Management Officer" means the person designated in Section 5 of this Order.

- (h) "Records management plan" means the plan developed under Section 6 of this Order.
- (i) "Retention period" means the minimum time that must pass after the creation, recording, or receipt of a record, or the fulfillment of certain actions associated with a record before it is eligible for destruction.
- Section 3. Authority Records Declared Public Property. All Authority records as defined in Section 1 of this Order are hereby declared to be the property of the Authority. No Authority official or employee has, by virtue of his or her position, any personal or property right to such records even though he or she may have developed or compiled them. The unauthorized destruction, removal from files, or use of such records is prohibited.
- **Section 4. Policy.** It is hereby declared to be the policy of the Authority to provide for efficient, economical, and effective controls over the creation, distribution, organization, maintenance, use, and disposition of all Authority records through a comprehensive system of integrated procedures for the management of records from their creation to their ultimate disposition, consistent with the requirements of the Texas Local Government Records Act and accepted records management practices.
- Section 5. Designation of the Records Management Officer. The Authority's attorney, Sanford Kuhl Hagan Kugle Parker Kahn LLP, shall serve as Records Management Officer for the Authority. As provided by state law, the name of any successive Records Management Officer shall be filed with the director and librarian of the Texas State Library within thirty days of the designation.

Section 6. Records Management Plan to be Developed; Approval of Plan; Authority of Plan:

- (a) The Records Management Officer shall develop a records management plan for the Authority for submission to the Board of Directors. The plan must contain policies and procedures designed to reduce the costs and improve the efficiency of record keeping, to protect adequately the essential records of the Authority, and to preserve properly those records of the Authority that are of historical value. The plan must be designed to enable the Records Management Officer to carry out effectively his or her duties prescribed by state law and this Order.
- (b) Once approved by the Board of Directors, the records management plan shall be binding on all offices, consultants, divisions, programs, commissions, bureaus, boards, committees, or similar entities of the Authority, and records shall be created, maintained, stored, microfilmed, or disposed of in accordance with the plan.
- (c) State law relating to the duties, other responsibilities, or record keeping requirements of a Authority consultant do not exempt the consultant or the records in the consultant's care from the application of this Order and the records management plan adopted under it and may not be used by the consultant as a basis for refusal to participate in the records management program of the Authority.
- Section 7. <u>Duties of Records Management Officer.</u> In addition to other duties assigned in this Order, the Records Management Officer shall:
- (a) administer the records management program and provide assistance to other Authority consultants in its implementation;
- (b) plan, formulate, and prescribe records disposition policies, systems, standards, and procedures;

- (c) in cooperation with other Authority consultants, identify essential records and establish a disaster plan for each Authority office to ensure maximum availability of the records in order to reestablish operations quickly and with minimum disruption and expense;
- (d) develop procedures to ensure the permanent preservation of the historically valuable records of the Authority;
 - (e) establish standards for filing and storage equipment and for record keeping supplies;
- (f) study the feasibility of and, if appropriate, establish a uniform filing system and a forms design and control system for the Authority;
 - (g) provide records management advice and assistance to all Authority consultants;
- (h) monitor records retention schedules and administrative rules issued by the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to determine if the records management program and the Authority's records control schedules are in compliance with state regulations;
- (i) disseminate to the Board of Directors and consultants information concerning state laws and administrative rules relating to local government records;
- (j) instruct Authority consultants and other personnel in policies and procedures of the records management plan and their duties in the records management program;
- (k) direct Authority consultants or other personnel in the conduct of records inventories in preparation for the development of records control schedules as required by state law and this Order;
- (l) ensure that the maintenance, preservation, microfilming, destruction, or other disposition of Authority records is carried out in accordance with the policies and procedures of the records management program and the requirements of state law;
- (m) maintain records on the volume of records destroyed under approved records control schedules, the volume of records microfilmed or stored electronically, and the estimated cost and space savings as the result of such disposal or disposition;
- (n) report as needed to the Board of Directors on the implementation of the records management plan, including summaries of the statistical and fiscal data compiled under Subsection (m); and
- (o) bring to the attention of the Board of Directors noncompliance by consultants or other Authority personnel with the policies and procedures of the records management program or the Local Government Records Act.
- <u>Section 8.</u> <u>Duties and Responsibilities of Authority Consultants.</u> In addition to other duties assigned in this Order, Authority consultants shall:
- (a) cooperate with the Records Management Officer in carrying out the policies and procedures established for the Authority for the efficient and economical management of records and in carrying out the requirements of this Order;
- (b) adequately document the transaction of government business and the services, programs, and duties for which the consultant and his or her staff are responsible; and

- (c) maintain the records in his or her care and carry out their preservation, microfilming, destruction, or other disposition only in accordance with the policies and procedures of the records management program of the Authority and the requirements of this Order.
- Section 9. Designation of Records Liaison Officers. Each consultant shall designate a member of his or her staff to serve as Records Liaison Officer for the implementation of the records management program. If the Records Management Officer determines that in the best interests of the records management program more than one Records Liaison Officer should be designated for a consultant, the consultant shall designate the number of Records Liaison Officers specified by the Records Management Officer. Persons designated as Records Liaison Officers shall be thoroughly familiar with all the records created and maintained by the consultant and shall have full access to all records of the Authority maintained by the consultant. In the event of the resignation, retirement, or dismissal of a person designated as Records Liaison Officer, the consultant shall promptly designate another person to fill the vacancy.

<u>Section 10.</u> <u>Duties and Responsibilities of Records Liaison Officers.</u> In addition to other duties assigned in this Order, Records Liaison Officers shall:

- (a) conduct or supervise the conduct of inventories of the records of the consultants in preparation for the development of records control schedules;
- (b) in cooperation with the Records Management Officer coordinate and implement the policies and procedures of the records management program; and
 - (c) disseminate information to their staff concerning the records management program.

Section 11. Records Control Schedule to be Developed; Approval; Filing with State.

- (a) The Records Management Officer, in cooperation with Records Liaison Officers, shall prepare records control schedules listing all records created or received by the consultant and the retention period for each record. Records control schedules shall also contain such other information regarding the disposition of Authority records as the records management plan may require.
- (b) Each records control schedule shall be monitored and amended as needed by the Records Management Officer on a regular basis to ensure that it is in compliance with records retention schedules issued by the state and that it continues to reflect the procedures and needs of the records management program of the Authority.
- (c) Before its adoption a records control schedule or amended schedule must be approved by the Board of Directors of the Authority.
- (d) Before its adoption a records control schedule must be submitted to and accepted for filing by the director and librarian of the Texas State Library as provided by state law. If a schedule is not accepted for filing, the schedule shall be amended to make it acceptable for filing. The Records Management Officer shall submit the records control schedules to the director and librarian of the Texas State Library.

<u>Section 12.</u> <u>Implementation of Records Control Schedules; Destruction of Records Under Schedule:</u>

(a) A records control schedule that has been approved and adopted by the Board of Directors of the Authority shall be implemented by consultants and Records Liaison Officers according to the policies and procedures of the records management plan.

- (b) A record whose retention period has expired on a records control schedule shall be destroyed unless an open records request is pending on the record, the subject matter of the record is pertinent to a pending lawsuit, or the consultant requests in writing to the Board of Directors that the record be retained for an additional period.
- (c) Prior to the destruction of a record under an approved records control schedule, authorization for the destruction must be obtained by the Records Management Officer.
- Section 13. Destruction of Unscheduled Records. A record that has not yet been listed on an approved records control schedule may be destroyed if its destruction has been approved in the same manner as records destroyed under an approved schedule and the Records Management Officer has submitted to and received back from the director and librarian of the Texas State Library an approved destruction authorization request.
- <u>Section 14.</u> <u>Development of Additional Policies.</u> The Board of Directors of the Authority shall develop such additional policies and procedures as may be necessary from time to time to comply with the requirements of the Local Government Records Act.
- **Section 15. Filing.** A certified copy of this Order shall be filed with the director and librarian of the Texas State Library no later than thirty days from the date hereof.
- <u>Section 16.</u> This Order supersedes previous programs adopted by the Board on records management.

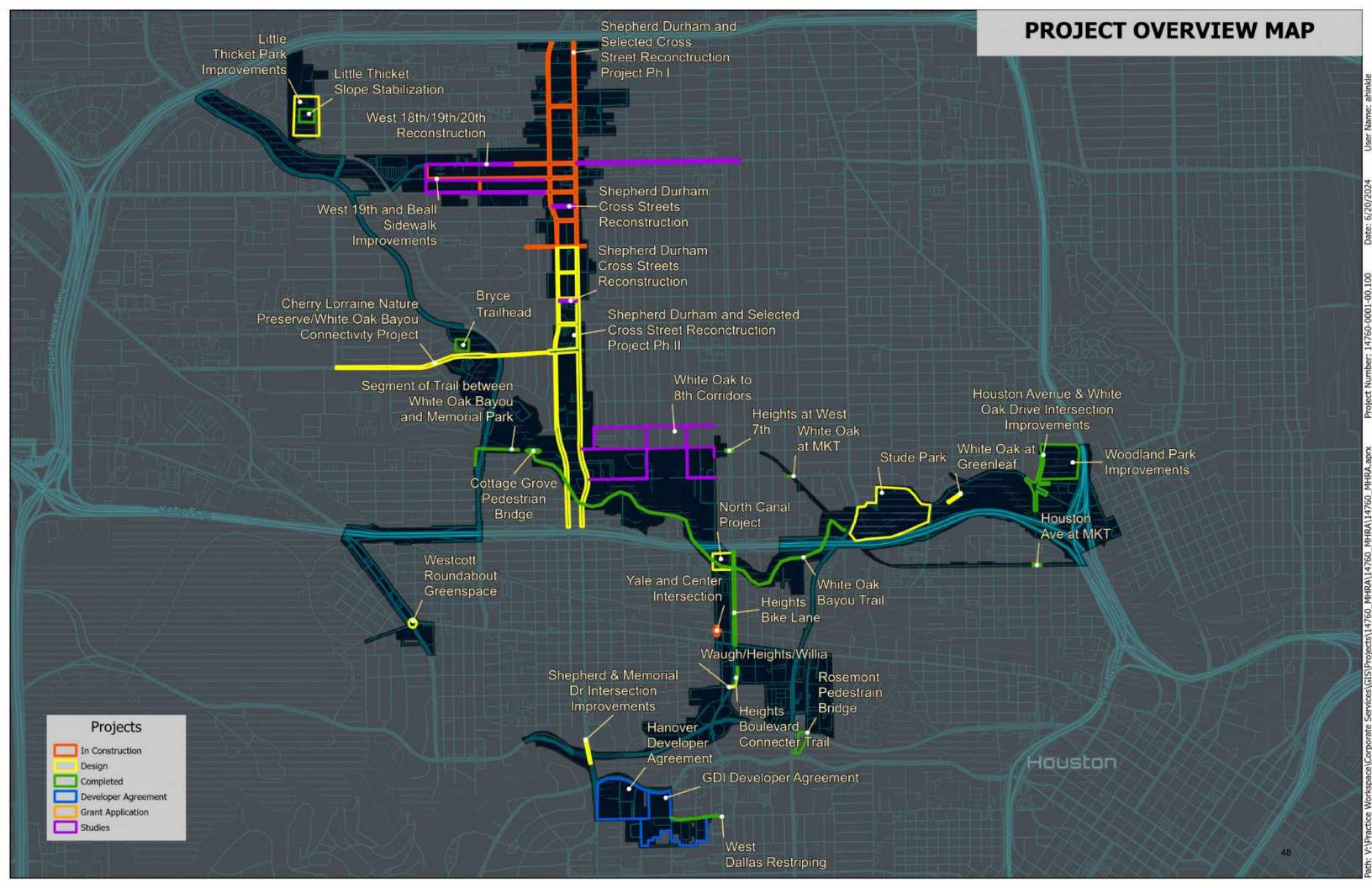

Quiddity Engineering, LLC (QE) appreciates the opportunity to present this proposal for design phase services related to the design modifications requested by the City of Houston for the Shepherd, Durham, and Selected Cross Streets Reconstruction project for Memorial Heights Redevelopment Authority (MHRA)/TIRZ No. 5.

The scope of work detailed below results from review of the project by the City administration following the 100% plan submittal for the project. The project understanding and scope of work reflect our current understanding of the agreed upon project. Should details change later, future discussions shall occur to solidify any changes and scope and fee as a result.

Project Understanding

The project will include modification of the final design of Shepherd Drive, Durham Drive, and West 11th Street to adjust the proposed lane widths and configurations requested by the City of Houston.

Based on the above, QE prepared the following scope of services and fee proposal for MHRA's consideration.

Scope of Services

Basic Services to be provided by QE and their subconsultants include:

1. General Project Management

QE will provide project administration, including management of the project team, budget, and schedule.

2. MHRA Progress Meetings

QE will continue communication with MHRA to share details regarding scope, schedule, and fee.

3. Team Progress Meetings

QE will continue team meetings throughout the life of the project to maintain continuity of design and to keep the project on schedule.

4. Public Agency and Stakeholder Coordination Modifications)

QE will continue to work with MHRA to engage the project stakeholders to understand general concerns, present design options, and coordinate construction activities. QE will continue regular attendance at monthly HPW Utility Coordination Committee meeting to help facilitate necessary relocations under the

City's Utility Relocation Ordinance.

5. Private Utility Coordination

QE will continue to meet with various private utility companies to review the project modifications, logistics, and general coordination associated with the project.

6. Modification of Design Plan Set

QE will modify the 100% design plan set to accommodate the lane width and configuration updates requested by the City of Houston. This is a linear project, and any modification of the typical section has a profound impact on the plan set. QE will revise the following sheets that will be modified:

- Summary of Quantities
- Traffic Signal Layouts
- Typical Sections
- Paving Plan & Profiles
- Driveway Tabulations
- Cross Sections
- Storm Plan & Profiles
- Storm Laterals

7. Modification of Estimations of Construction Costs and Bid Form

QE will modify the final estimations of construction costs prompted by the plan modifications. QE will update the final Bid Form and other related specification sections within the Project Manual to be issued as part of the bid documents.

8. Internal QC Review

A Quality Control review of the modifications will be performed by each discipline prior to the issuance of the addendum.

Assumptions

- 1. This proposal is based on requests from the City of Houston.

Quiddity Engineering (QE) appreciates the opportunity to present this proposal for Final Design services to update the proposed improvements to include a shared used path on either side of Shepherd Drive and to extend the existing bridge on the east side of Shepherd Drive in connection with the Pedestrian Improvements Shepherd at Memorial project for Memorial Heights Redevelopment Authority (MHRA)/TIRZ No. 5. QE will perform the service as described below.

The scope of work detailed below results from coordination with MHRA and the Houston Public Works (HPW) during the early stages of the design process. Existing structural components presented an opportunity to improve upon the scope presented in Work Authorization 1 enhancing additional connectivity as part of this project. Various alternatives were analyzed and presented (refer to Exhibit 1) which led to the additions detailed below. The project understanding and scope of work reflect our current understanding of the agreed upon changes in scope.

Project Understanding

The additions to the project include the following components:

- Engagement of a Structural Engineer to perform structural analysis to support the proposed safety improvements within the project limits.
- Construction of a 10-foot Shared Use Path on the west side of Shepherd Drive, along DePelchin Children's Center, from the existing METRO Bus stop (6567), up to Dickson Street.
- Construction of a 10-foot Shared Use Path on the east side of Shepherd Drive, along St. Thomas High School, from the existing METRO Bus stop (456), up to Dickson Street.
- Extension to the existing bridge on the east side of Shepherd Drive, between the limits of the Memorial Drive overpass. The bridge extension will include ramps, improved railing, and allow for attachments of proposed pedestrian poles.

Based on the above, QE prepared the following scope of services and fee proposal for MHRA's consideration.

Scope of Services

1. General Project Management

QE will provide continued project administration, including management of the project team, budget, and schedule and preparation/submission of monthly invoices.

2. Data Collection

Records Requests – Review existing City of Houston public utility record drawings and CenterPoint Energy, AT&T, and other pertinent private utility record drawings. Review structural drawing for the existing Shepherd Bridge over Memorial Drive. Conduct a site visit with the Structural Engineer to collect pertinent first-hand knowledge of the land, its condition, context, adjacent land uses, and access needs. Assess electrical conditions. Review survey data. Confirm conditions/proposed features during design.

- 3. DePelchin Shared Use Path Connection (Hourly)
- 4. St. Thomas High School Shared Use Path Connection (Hourly)
- 5. Extension of Existing Bridge (Hourly)

For each of these design elements, QE proposes the following scope:

- a. Prepare Design Plan Set (60%, 90%, 100%)
 Civil Design Based on City, MHRA, and design team coordination efforts, QE will design the proposed shared use path within the existing rights-of-way while utilizing the existing roadway pavement. The plan set with include proposed plan improvements, floodplain mitigation, traffic control plans, and stormwater pollution prevention plans.
- b. Prepare Estimations of Construction Costs (60%, 90%, 100%)

 An estimate of construction cost will also be provided at each submittal stage.
- c. Prepare Project Specifications (60%, 90%, 100%)

 The bid schedule and specifications for all disciplines will be included in the project manual, which will be provided to MHRA at the 60% and 90% submittal stages for review and finalized as part of the bid-ready construction documents along with permitted plans.
- d. Internal QC Review (60%, 90%, 100%)

Proposed Traffic Signal Modifications – QE will analyze modifications needed with the addition of the proposed extension to the existing Sphered Drive bridge. Modifications to the design will include coordination with structural engineer on details for attaching the proposed pedestrian poles to the bridge structure and details on boring through existing retaining walls to connect conduit to adjacent features.

2. Surveying Services (Hourly)

a. <u>DePelchin Shared Use Path Connection</u>

QE will gather additional topographic survey along Shepherd Drive beginning where the previous topographic survey ended, as part of Work Authorization 1, and extend north of the existing wheelchair ramp/traffic signal poles located on the north side of Dickson Street. QE will locate existing trees 4-inch diameter and larger located between said west right-of-way and the west back of curb of Shepherd Drive. The survey will depict the right-of-way lines of Shepherd Drive and Dickson Drive and set two (2) control points and one (1) temporary elevation benchmark within this survey area and illustrate these points on the Survey Control Map.

b. St. Thomas High School Shared Use Path Connection

QE will gather additional topographic survey along Shepherd Drive beginning where the previous topographic survey ended, as part of Work Authorization 1, and extend north of the existing wheelchair ramp/traffic signal poles located on the north side of Dickson Street. QE will locate existing trees 4-inch diameter and larger located between said east right-of-way and the east back of curb of Shepherd Drive. The survey will depict the right-of-way lines of Shepherd Drive and Dickson Drive and set two (2) control points and one (1) temporary elevation benchmark within this survey area and illustrate these points on the Survey Control Map.

c. Extension of Existing Bridge

QE will gather additional topographic survey to locate one (1) cross section of the depressed portion of Memorial Drive near the existing Shepherd bridge along the east crossing and one (1) cross section of Memorial Drive 15 feet to the east. Work will be performed with a laser scanner to provide clearances between Memorial Drive and the underside of the Shepherd Drive bridge.

3. <u>Structural Services (Lump Sum)</u>

Structural Design — Based on HPW, MHRA, and design team coordination efforts, CSF will design the proposed extension to the existing Shepherd bridge, retaining walls, pedestrian pole anchoring to existing bridge deck, and proposed ramp attachments into existing bridge deck. The structural sheets to be included in the final set are proposed bridge modifications, framing plans, calculations, and structural details. CSF will provide the structural specifications, cost estimates associated with the structural designs, and construction phase services. A detailed breakdown of the structural design level of effort to complete these services is provided in Attachment B.

Assumptions

- This proposal is based on the recommendations made in collaboration between MHRA, QE, CSF, and HPW
 as depicted in Exhibit 1. Deviations from the recommendations may require revisions to QE's scope and
 fees or Additional Services.
- The design of the Pedestrian Improvements Shepherd Memorial project will be based on the requirements of the City of Houston Infrastructure Design Manual, dated November 27, 2023. Should the City change any criteria, it would likely result in a change in design scope and request for Additional Services. It is possible this could also impact the recommendations being assumed as part of this proposal and result in additional construction costs.

Schedule

QE understands there is an aggressive schedule for the project to complete the design phase in six (6) months. QE will prepare a project schedule showing the tasks/milestone dates that need to be met to meet MHRA's scheduling needs.

Proposed Fee

QE is requesting a total fee of \$110,963.00 for the Final design and services described in this proposal.

Invoices will be submitted by QE monthly on a percentage of completion basis and the full amount will be due and payable to QE upon receipt. If the MHRA objects to all or any portion of an invoice, MHRA will notify QE in writing within seven (7) calendar days of the invoice date and pay that portion of the invoice not in dispute. MHRA will pay an additional charge of 0.75% of the invoiced amount per month for any payment received by QE more than thirty (30) days from receipt of the invoice, excepting any portion of the invoiced amount in dispute and resolved in favor of the MHRA. Payment thereafter will be first applied to accrued interest and then to the principal unpaid amount. In the event of a conflict between this agreement and the PSA, the PSA governs.

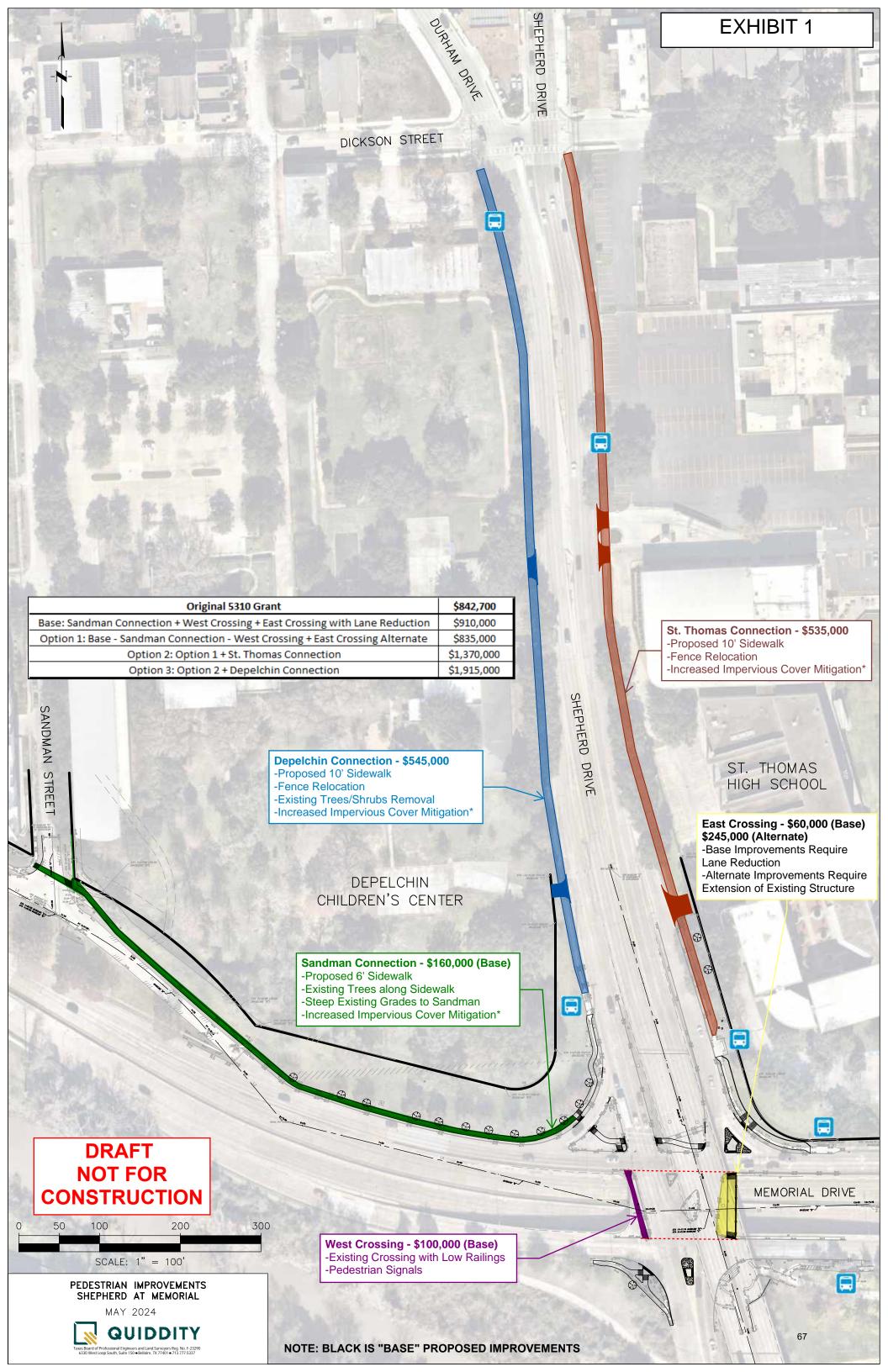
